Klein at first disowned the film after learning that it would be composed almost entirely of period footage and narration, with virtually no interview material with sources.[16] The film premiered at the 2009 Berlin Film Festival and aired in the UK on Channel 4's More4 documentary channel on 1 September 2009. It made its American premiere at the 2010 Sundance Film Festival, alongside Winterbottom's following film. At the festival, Klein, who had reconciled herself with the filmmakers' approach, participated in a Q&A with Winterbottom and Whitecross.
Waste Land[2]	2	Е	95	2010	Waste Land is the uplifting story of artist Vik Muniz who travels to the world's largest landfill, Jardim Gramacho outside Rio de Janeiro, to collaborate with a lively group of catadores, or pickers of recyclable materials, who find a way to the most prestigious auction house in London via the surprising transformation of refuse into contemporary art. The catadores work in a co-operative founded and led by Sebastião Carlos Dos Santos, the ACAMJG, or Association of Pickers of Jardim Gramacho, who dreamed of improving life for his community. Waste Land received unanimously positive reviews as "an uplifting portrait of the power of art and the dignity of the human spirit.

This film tells of the hardships and struggles as well as the community and creativity of the Cuban people during this difficult time. Cubans share how they transitioned from a highly mechanized, industrial agricultural system to one using organic methods of farming and local, urban gardens. It is an unusual look into the Cuban culture during this economic crisis, which they call "The Special Period." The film opens with a short history of Peak Oil, a term for the time in our history when world oil production will reach its all-time peak and begin to decline forever. Cuba, the only country that has faced such a crisis – the massive reduction of fossil fuels – is an example of options and hope.

Silent Spring	?	13+	56	2007	In 1962, Houghton Mifflin published Rachel Carson's Silent Spring, an instant bestseller that was critical of the use of pesticides. Controversy ensued: the chemical industry launched attacks on Carson and threatened to sue the publisher; President Kennedy's science advisor, Jerome Weisner, established a panel to study the issue; CBS ran a special on the book; and Senator Abraham Ribicoff initiated a congressional review of environmental pollution. Rachel Carson's Silent Spring, part of the PBS American Experience series, looks at the making of Silent Spring and the subsequent controversy. The film draws on archival footage from the chemical industry, Carson's writings, interviews, speeches, letters, and photographs, and interviews with scientists, colleagues, and politicians involved in the controversy. Although the documentary touches on historical topics such as prejudice against women scientists, the growth of the chemical industry in the 1950s, and the collaboration between government, science, and industry, the focus is on Carson—her life, her fascination with nature, and her quiet determination that allowed her to challenge government, the chemical industry, and agribusiness.
Farm for the Future	2	No cert	50	2009	It features a crash course in peak oil from Colin Campbell and Richard Heinberg, a trip to the Soil Association conference, a trip round Martin Crawford's forest garden and much more besides. There is some great archive film of horses and hayricks, and some film from the early 80s of her dad ploughing their fields, followed by a riot of birds, all wanting to get at the soil creatures being exposed by the ploughing, which she contrasts with now, the tractor ploughing the same field, but with not a bird in sight, so impoverished has the soil life become. It offeres a powerful combination of looking back and looking forward, underpinned all the time by her clear deep affection she has for the farm itself. and the deep respect she has for both her father and his work. It was surprisingly personal and moving. Many people watching it may find themselves having Eureka moments as regards some of the insights about soil, ecosystems and the idea that food production need not necessarily involve huge tractors and lashings of diesel. It is also very powerful for people to start to realise that food production and biodiversity are not necessarily, as is often believed, mutually exclusive.
This Changes Everything	2				This is an epic attempt to re-imagine the vast challenge of climate change. Filmed over 200 days in 9 countries on five continents over 4 years, the film presents communities on the front line. Klein builds to her most controverisal and exciting idea; that we can sieze the existential crisis of climate change to transform our failed economic system into something radically better.

Honeybees shows us that stability is just as unhealthy as unlimited growth, that crisis and disasters are triggering evolution and that salvation sometimes comes from a completely unexpected direction.
